PROGETTO HORIZON EUROPE ALPHABETICA (GA: 101177819): Assessment of the impact of arts-based education

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Venue: Dipartimento di Interpretazione e Traduzione – Campus di Forlì and Dipartimento di Sociologia e Diritto dell'Economia, Campus di Bologna

1. Introduction

ALPHABETICA aims to provide effective solutions that allow children and young people at risk of poverty or social exclusion to access arts and arts-based education through co-creative participatory research actions. For some young people, access to 'art' is limited; often understood as a luxury or a leisure activity that may feel inaccessible or irrelevant. For others, their creative endeavours might not be recognised from their own perspective, as being 'art'. ALPHABETICA will carry out 12 pilot actions across 8 European countries aimed at enhancing the transformative effect of active participation in community-driven artistic co-creation activities. Collectively, the research pilot actions cover a range of school settings and out-of-school community settings with children from 3 to 18, as well as young people and adults of various ages.

The project is informed by a synthesis of theories of youth participatory action research, Theory of Change, pedagogies of care, love and enchantment, pedagogies of past, present and the imagined future, and the more-than-human approach. This conceptual framework invites a reflexive and indepth exploration of children and young people's complex everyday realities, while offering opportunities for creative self-expression and meaning-making, participation, skills-development, and relationship-building.

ALPHABETICA will take a transformative approach by:

- 1. providing qualitative and quantitative data on attitudes towards and perceptions of arts by children, families, educators and policymakers,
- 2. using participatory and caring approaches and pedagogies to provide an evidence-based assessment of the instrumental outcomes of arts-based education, their transformative impact,

and their transferability to children and young people's other life domains,

- 3. taking and teaching a caring approach that through arts-based education will sustain a commitment to lifelong learning,
- 4. providing scientifically robust recommendations for policy action.

2. Research Objectives

The post-doc research project is embedded in the ALPHABETICA project and will contribute to the development and implementation of four pilot actions:

Artistic and experiential	This pilot action aims to overcome the increasing cultural, linguistic and ethnic
approaches in plurilingual	diversity and socio-economic inequalities that formal and informal education
youth community	systems are facing as multiple challenges. It aims to develop both youth's
education	multilingual and artistic awareness, and its far-reaching implications, through
(ARTEAPPYCOM)	the affordances offered by experiential, arts-based approaches.
IntegrArte	The pilot aims at co-constructing arts-based tools to fight against discrimination and sustain respect for diversities (gender, sexual orientation, national origin, religion etc.) among youngsters (11- 13 years-old). It proposes innovative artistic activities to prevent discrimination, marginalisation, hate speech and racism. Such devices will be co-constructed by teachers, researchers and artists to understand what forms discrimination can take and reflect with the students on how social media can amplify its impact on youngsters' lives.
Sharing dreams (SHARD)	Imagination as a tool for social transformation through the metamorphosis of exchanged and shared dreams into artworks. This metamorphosis is possible through artistic language. The pilot aims to recover the dreams of a community in order to construct, through aesthetic and artistic experience, a possibility of transforming reality. Building the future by imagining it.
(FOSTERART) / Italy and Poland	FOSTERART takes inspiration from an initiative experimented in a few Italian cities. By collaborating with schools, the pilot action will set up in Forlì, Italy and Krakow, Poland a network of families accustomed to attending cinemas, theatres, libraries, and museums to accompany families that do not have access to these places for a variety of reasons. In this way, a set of shared cultural experiences is created, between resource families and recipient families.

By relying on Youth Participatory Action Research (YPAR), pedagogies of care, love and enchantment, pedagogies of past, present and the imagined future, and the more-than-human approach, and in order to produce scientifically robust research aimed at corroborating and promoting the pivotal role played by arts and arts-based education, the post-doc research project has the following objectives:

1. Develop collaborative and participatory practices with stakeholders aimed at providing all children and young people with competences to nurture cultural awareness and expression and assess.

- 2. Contribute to the drafting and piloting of the international survey on attitudes towards and perceptions of arts in education.
- **3.** Contribute to the dissemination of the project results.

The post-doc fellow will develop the project's activities with the tutor. The research fellow will be directly involved in interactions with teachers, families and pupils in Schools and associations of the Forlì and Bologna municipalities.

The post-doc fellow will also contribute to the development of indicators aimed at assessing the transformative impacts of arts-based education, and their transferability to children and young people's other life domains.
