**Assessment criteria:**

The selection will be carried out through a comparative assessment of qualifications and CV, as well as an oral interview, on the basis of the following criteria.

1. Relevance to the project area

Fit of the candidate's background with philosophy of medicine, applied bioethics, and/or conceptual analysis applied to biomedical sciences

2. Research and methodological skills

Documented experience in one or more of the following will be positively assessed: conceptual/argument-based research in applied philosophy and bioethics; qualitative research (interviews, focus groups, thematic analysis, etc.) and/or mixed methods; literature reviews (narrative / scoping / systematic); analysis of guidelines, health policy documents, regulations, or institutional practices.

3. Other work experiences related to the project theme:

Experience with patient and caregiver involvement in research (PPI, participatory research, co-design) and/or familiarity with the literature on participatory science; participation in interdisciplinary and/or international projects, particularly involving healthcare stakeholders.

4. Relevant scientific publications

Quality and relevance of publications to the project themes. Applicants must provide a list of up to 5 publications.

5. English proficiency and transferable skills

Excellent command of English (written and spoken), ability to work both independently and collaboratively, reliability in meeting deadlines, and willingness to engage in structured project work.
